Bill Summary:			Taxes on gasoline and diesel fuel will be indexed to inflation, meaning the taxes charged per gallon will fluctuate with inflation and deflation. Currently, 24 cents per gallon is charged on gasoline. That tax has not changed in several years, but the buying power of the 24 cents has decreased. By indexing fuel taxes to inflation rates, the revenue generated from the index will maintain its buying power through inflationary times.

Title: Repeal gun free zones and preemption amendments.

Description: AN ACT relating to concealed weapons; repealing gun free zones; providing for the carrying of concealed weapons as specified; clarifying that only the state legislature may regulate firearms, weapons and ammunition as specified; amending a definition; and providing for an effective date.
